The following resolution was offered by C/Betcher, seconded by C/Dahling and duly adopted;

GOODHUE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 88-1

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE DISPLAY OF RURAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS BY GOODHUE COUNTY RESIDENTS LIVING OUTSIDE INCORPORATED CITIES.

The County Board of Goodhue County ordains:

Section 1 Police:

The intent of this ordinance is to minimize loss of life and property by enabling emergency personnel to quickly locate emergency situations through the use of Rural Identification Numbers.

Section 2 Definitions:

Subdivision 1. "Rural Identification Number" means the number contained on the red reflectorized 9"x14" sign issued by Goodhue County as authorized by M.S. 365.15.

Subdivision 2. "Owner" means one who owns a parcel of land located outside incorporated cities which contains a structure of any kind.

Section 3 Requirements:

An owner shall apply for, display and maintain a Rural Identification Number. The owner shall display and maintain the Rural Identification Number sign issued to him/her in a manner so that the Rural Identification Number is clearly visable from the roadway. The Rural Identification Number must be displayed at the best possible site adjacent to the highway and the driveway. However, the Rural Identification Number sign shall not be placed within the right-of-way of state trunk highways or interstate highways.

Owners of parcels which contain more than one residential dwelling must apply for, display and maintain individual Rural Identification Numbers for each dwelling. Owners must display the Rural Identification Number at the entrance to the parcel and also clearly display on the individual dwelling, the last set of numbers found on the Rural Identification Number sign.
